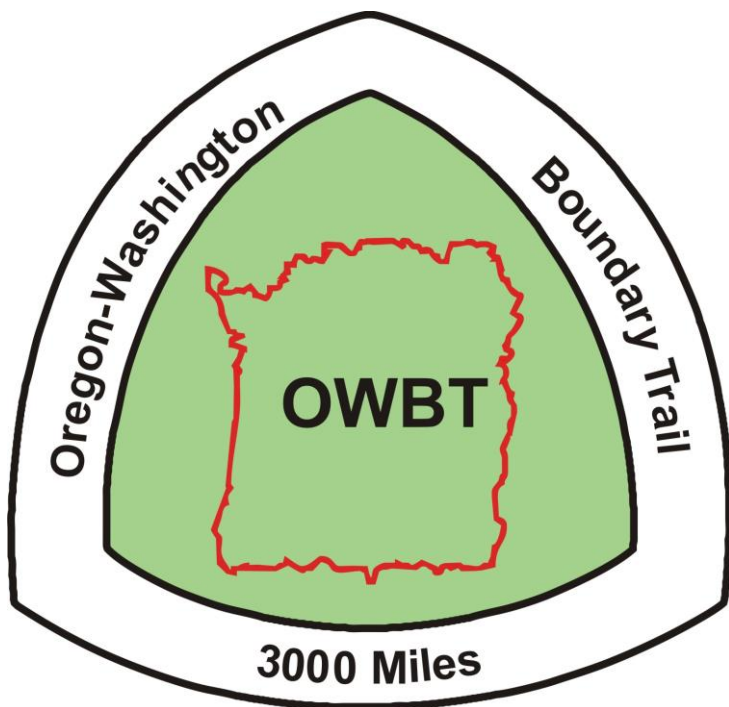

Gear, Equipment & Skills

The writers assume that most hikers attempting the OWBT are seasoned backpackers who have their own equipment. That said, we recommend going as light as possible. Because there are significant bushwhacks with dense brush on the route, make sure you have protection for your pack and bring good rain gear. You may encounter snow along the way, particularly in a high snow year, and you might want to carry either crampons, micro-spikes, and/or ice axes. Be aware of snow levels and snow melt before you leave. Consult the web for good resources for ultra-light gear.

A good GPS (we use the Garmin 60CX and 64s) with the tracks loaded is highly recommended – in fact, it is pretty much necessary. Map and compass is also highly advised. Make sure you know how to use this navigation equipment – you will need it. Bear spray is optional – you will be in grizzly country in northern Idaho.

The trail is difficult and to finish within the hiking season expect to consistently average about 25 miles per day. A good fitness regimen prior to beginning the trek is highly recommended.

Guidebook and Maps

Since this is a route and not an official trail, the only resource describing the trail is our Oregon-Washington Boundary Trail Hikers Guide. The Oregon-Washington Boundary Trail Town Guide is the only printed resource for re-supply information for the IBT. In 2019, both books will be available for purchase on Amazon in paper and Kindle versions. We highly recommend using a GPS and Yeti has updated GPX files for your use. They can be downloaded from his website, www.fultek.com/owbt where you can also find an OWBT Misc file with a list of maps you may need, Post Office info & more.

It is also advisable to carry additional forest service or BLM maps. You may need these if you have to find alternate routes or bail out routes. A list of maps that are needed for the OWBT is printed in this book -- see the map table on page 5.

Getting to the Trailhead

The trail starts on a bike path in Clarkston, WA at the eastern end of Fair St. You can drive to Clarkston, a large town with full services, where you can buy supplies and find restaurants and lodging. Greyhound services Lewistown, ID which is just over the Snake River from Clarkston (see www.greyhound.com), a distance of about 2 miles.

Additional options for meals, re-supply or stays in towns along the OWBT:

Section A: Clarkston, WA to Imnaha, OR

6.8 miles from the start of the trail is small town called Asotin (see map). Asotin has a nice bakery where you can get baked goods, coffee, & sandwiches. You could get your day's meals here instead of stopping and cooking along the way.

Section B: Imnaha, OR to Weiser, ID

83.2 miles into this section is the Brownlee Dam, which has a nice campground with showers. A small café is a few miles past the dam and is before a dry section that has a fair amount of bushwhacking.

Section W: Spirit Lake, ID to St Maries, ID

75.2 miles from Spirit Lake you walk right through (on a bike path) the small town of Harrison, ID (see map) which has restaurants, lodging, RV Park w/tenting, a deli/market, and ice cream! A pleasant stop.

Section X: St Maries, ID to Moscow, ID

54.7 miles from St Maries you walk right through the small town of Potlatch, ID (see map) which has a restaurant, a good market, mini mart, B&B and RV Park w/tent sites.

Lodging/Camping: Several. *Motel 6* is right next to the trail. 222 Bridge St, Clarkston, WA 99403, (509) 758-1631, Guest laundry, AC, TV, WIFI; *Quality Inn* (509) 758-9500; *Best Western* (509) 758-9551; *Clarkston RV Park*, (509) 758-3544.

If you are staying at *Motel 6*, you can get to the trail head by walking east across the parking lot to Fair St and then down by the river to the bike path. Then head south (see map). This is also where you end the trail.

Restaurants: Several, *Tomato Brothers* is a great Italian restaurant next to Motel 6

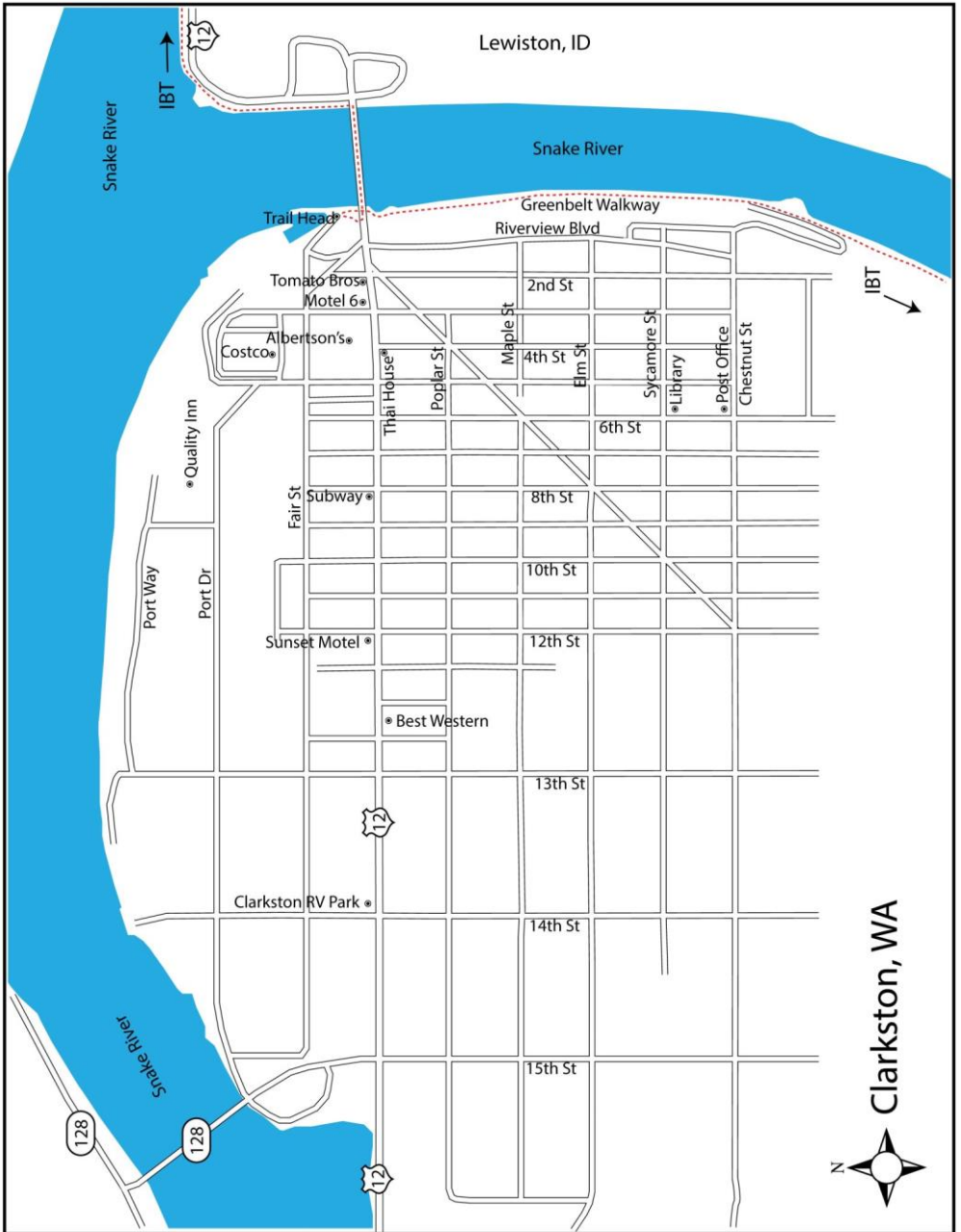
Internet/WIFI: Library, most motels have WIFI

Other: Hells Canyon Ranger station is on the trail in Clarkston: 2535 Riverside Drive, Clarkston, Washington 99403 phone 509-758-0616 Open 7:30 to 4:30 M-F

Asotin is about 6.5 miles from Clarkston via the bike path and has the fabulous *Matt’s Grill*. They make great sandwiches, including for breakfast, and have good coffee. A MUST STOP.

Camping is available at the RV Park located on the Snake River Hwy once it becomes a gravel road, approximately 27 miles after Clarkston. Camping also available in the old Schoolhouse about 34 miles from Clarkston. It has a good roof, no windows or doors, and a privy across the street in the parking lot.

Restaurants: *Daily’s Bakery* has baked goods, sandwiches, coffee and drinks. NOW CLOSED!

Matt’s Grill serves German cuisine (B,L,D). Excellent food & service.

Yeti bought sandwiches for lunch & dinner here allowing him to carry a day’s less food.

We ate at Matt’s Grill in 2018 & it was very good!

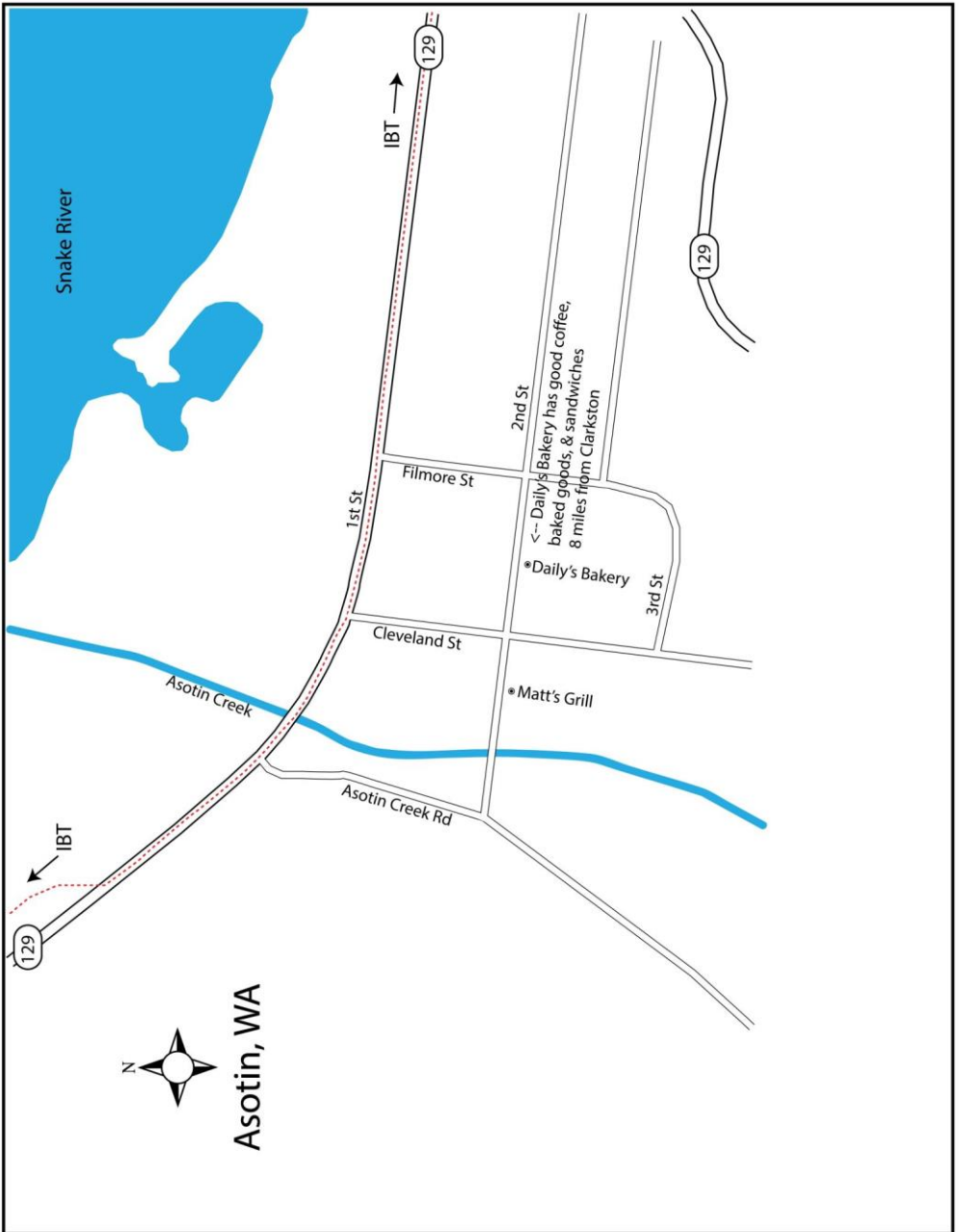

Restaurants: *Imnaha Store & Tavern* (B,L,D). Try the Big T – their specialty sandwich. As of 2013 No credit card, cash only.

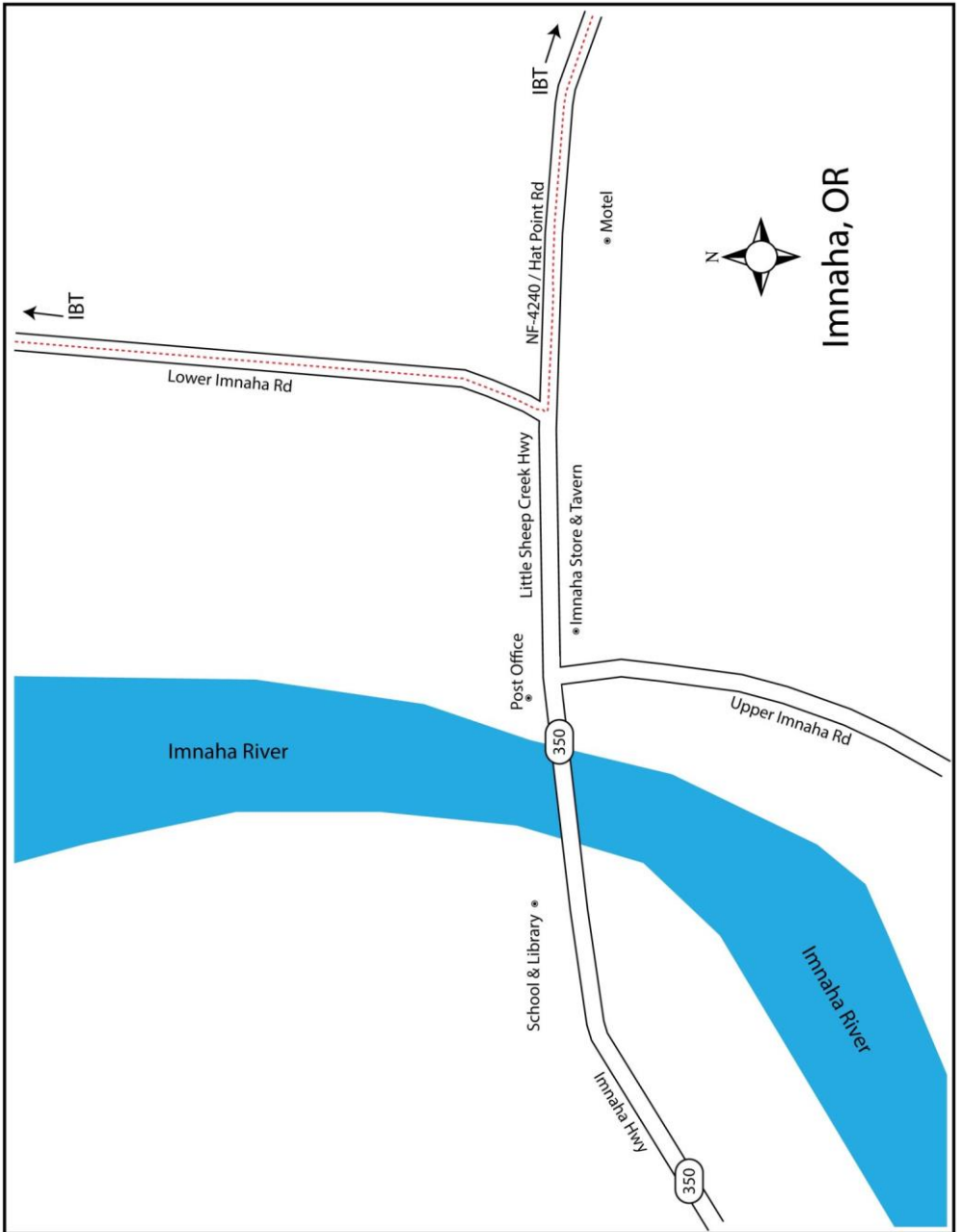
Library: Library is in the school and has one computer available. Extremely friendly people. Sat 10am-2pm; Tu 12-4pm; Closed on Friday but ask at post office, they may open it for you.

Other: Call ahead to the Imnaha Store & Tavern/Motel as it may be closed early in the season. It was open when Yeti got there in 2013 and 2016 (mid-May). 83 miles later, after the Brownlee Reservoir & Woodhead Park Campground, there is a good café before you turn up into the Hitt Mountains. It’s worth a stop.

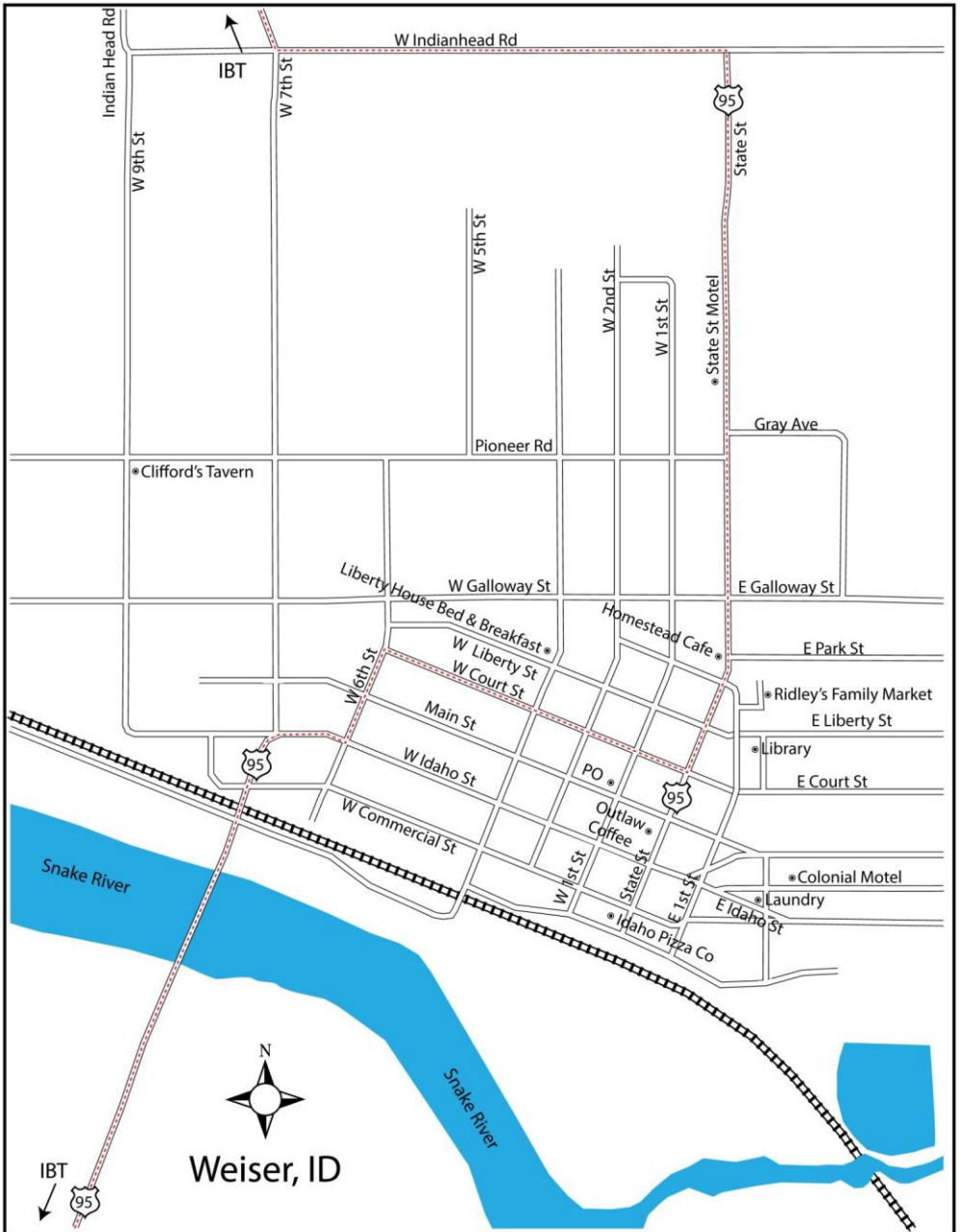

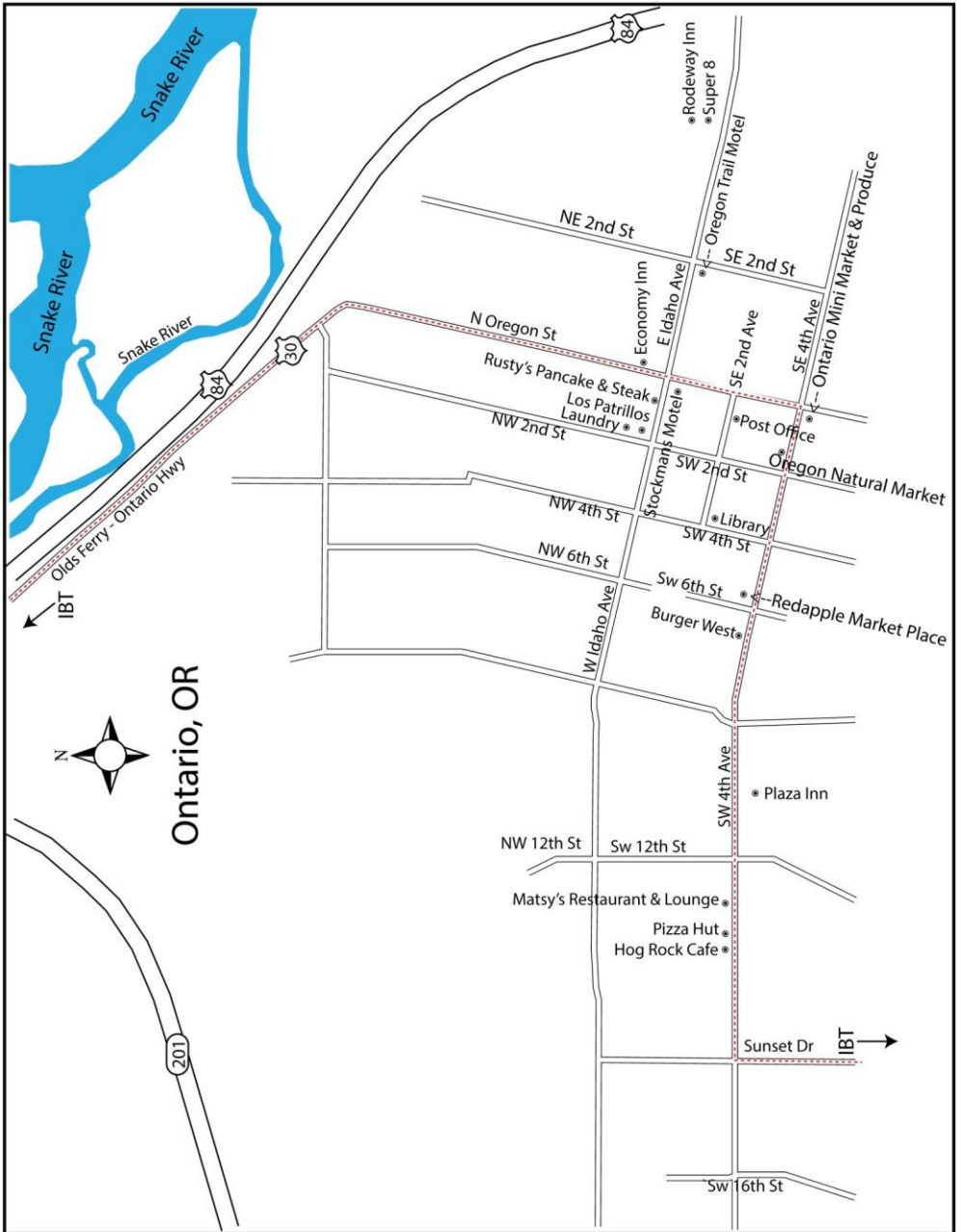

Has WIFI. \$75-95 (541) 586-2800. Price is dependent on number of people and whether you want breakfast. Limited days open, so call ahead to check room availability. Restaurant is open 9am-10pm, closed Mon, Tu. Breakfast served to guests 7am on. Food is fabulous.

Restaurants: *Flatiron Steakhouse* (B,L,D); *Rockhouse Coffee* has good coffee and sells gift items as well, 8-5pm.

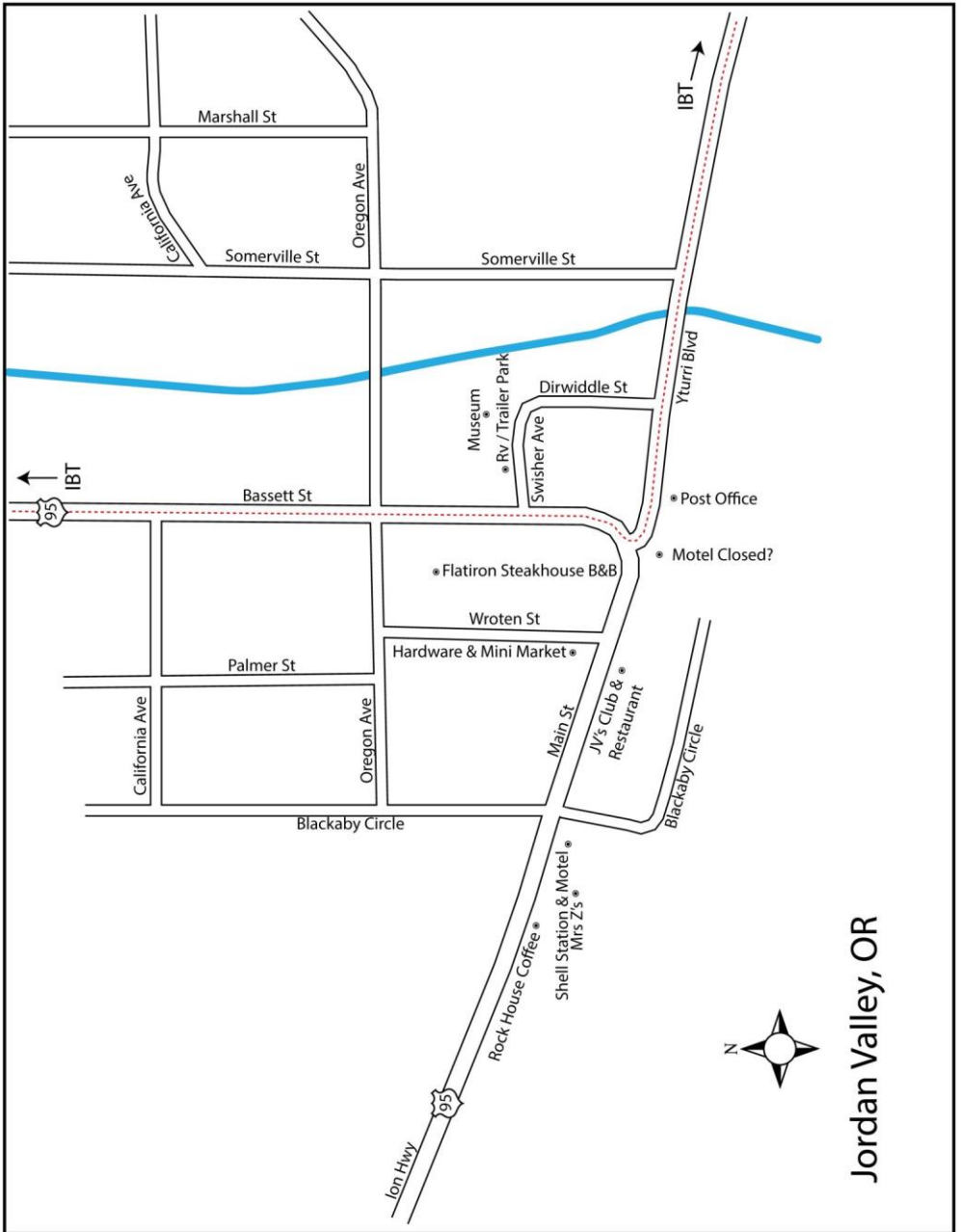

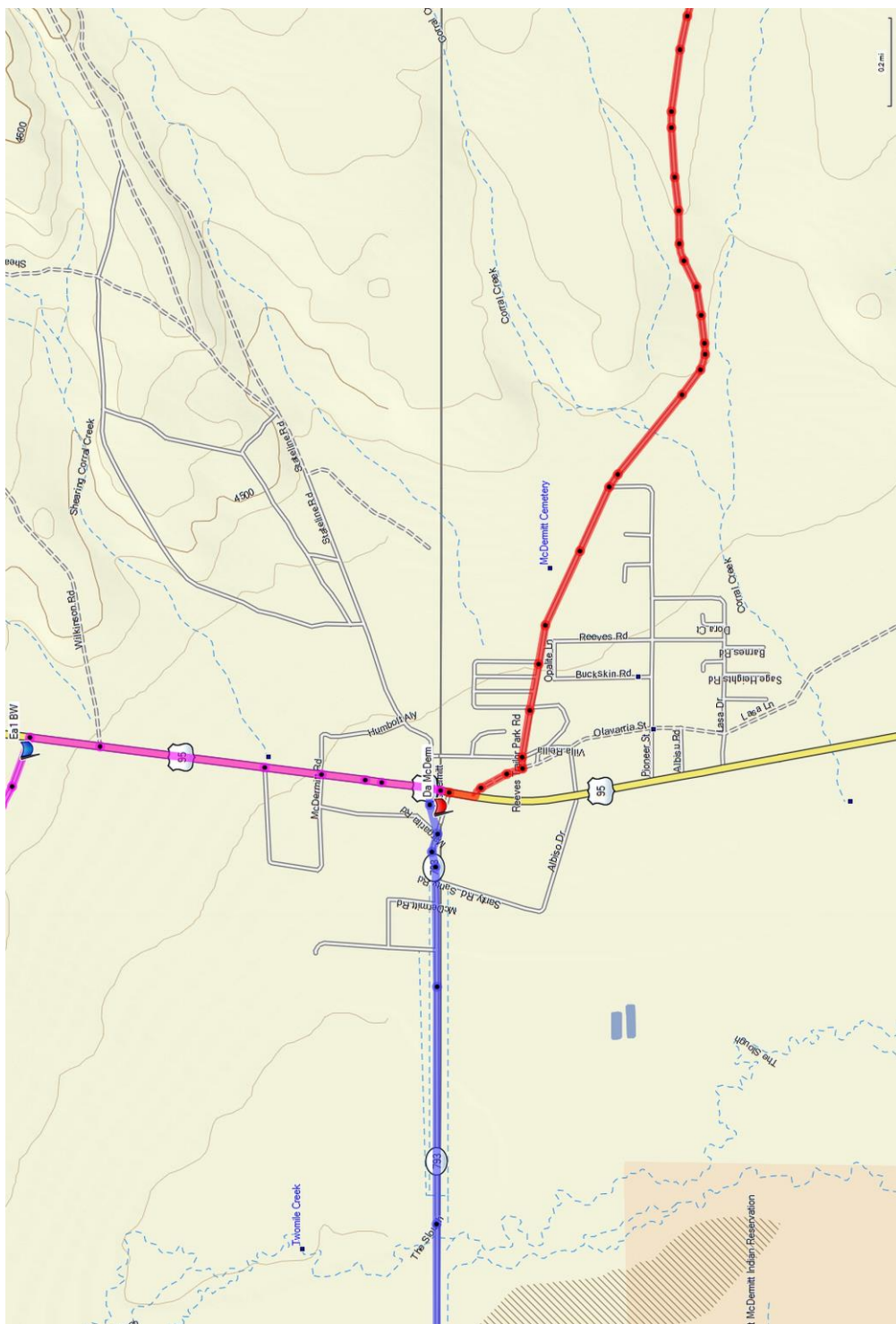

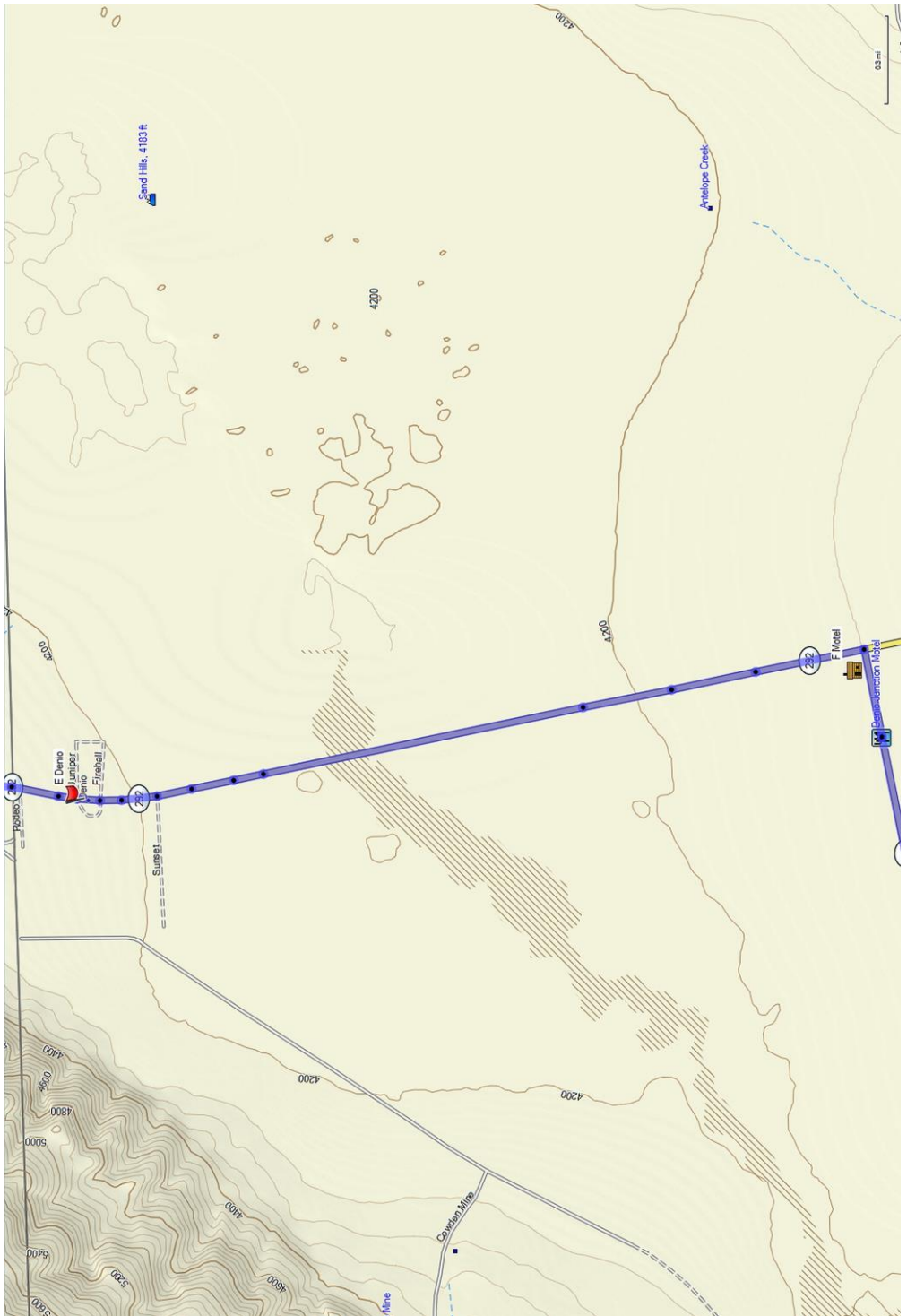
Recreational activities available in the Denio area include fishing, opal mining, rockhounding, hunting, and visiting the hot springs.

OVERVIEW: Ashland is a great place for a zero day!! Many motels, restaurants, outfitter, Safeway and Albertson's Supermarkets, Food Co-op, PO, laundry, internet, Shakespeare Festival, movie theater, public bus system, alcohol/HEET.

GETTING HERE: Don't try to hitch to Ashland from the spot where the trail hits Highway 99. I suggest walking the mile along Highway 99 to Callahan's (with your thumb out!) then trying to hitch the interstate on-ramp from there. There is more traffic near Callahan's. At this point, Highway 99 and I-5 are the same road. It's about 12 miles to Ashland.

MAGS (2002): Ashland has good size grocery stores and just about anything you need. There is a nice little public transit system for getting around to get your groceries, mailing out packages and getting around town in general. I bought groceries and mailed them ahead to Crater Lake and Shelter Cove. The local outfitters will give a 10% discount to PCT hikers. Be sure to inquire about it. Ashland also has a Shakespeare Festival. Tickets are expensive, BUT they do give a free "sampler" in the park. I liked Ashland . . . it had a cool vibe. Great place to rest up before heading into the rest of Oregon.

BUS SERVICE: RVTD (Rogue Valley Transportation District) busses run Monday - Friday from around 7am to around 5pm. Buses DO NOT run on weekends or holidays. Pick up a bus schedule at the Chamber of Commerce (541-482-3486) or the Library. For an automated schedule, call RVTD at 541-608-2400. To talk to an actual person, call 541-779-2877 Mon - Fri between 6am and 5:30pm.

GARLIC MAN (2003): The bus is free and does a large loop out past Safeway to Albertson's, the UPS Store, and several other large stores. There is a schedule and the buses seem to follow it pretty well. It costs \$1.00 - I believe - to go to Medford.

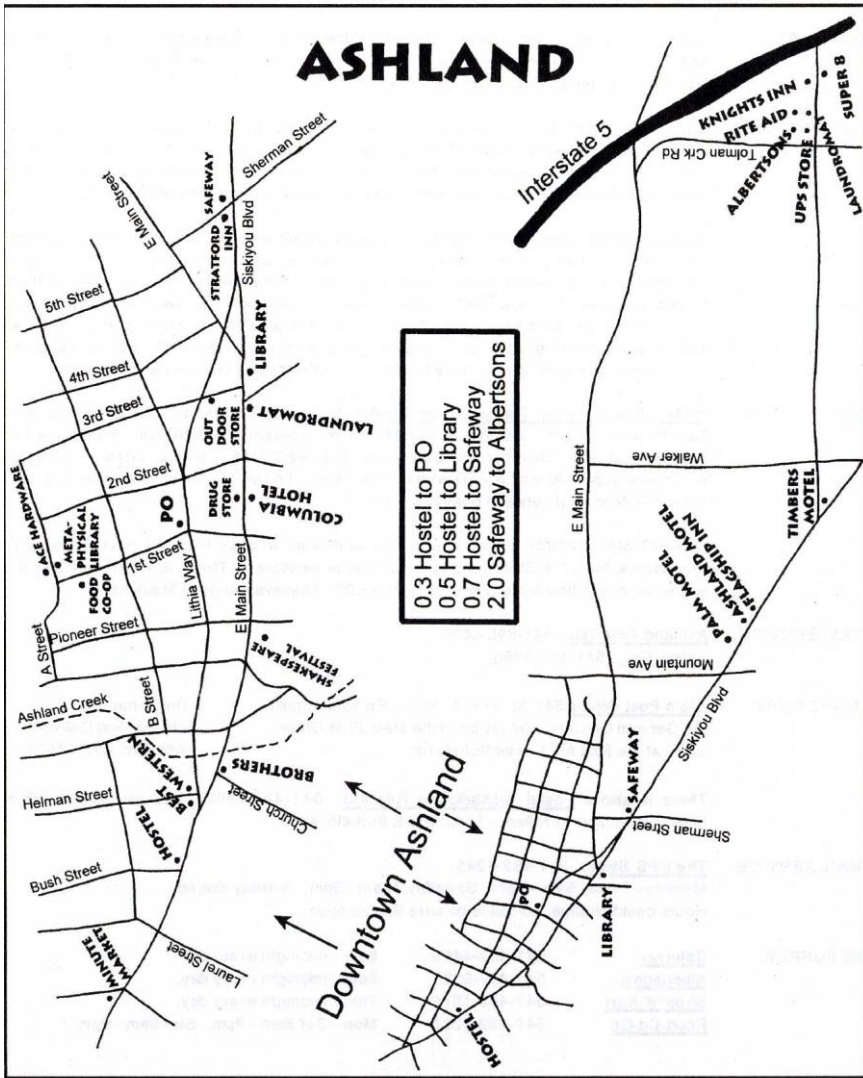

GANJ (2004): We stayed at the American Youth Hostel the first night. They had strict rules like leaving between 11am - 5pm and no alcohol. So we got a room at a hotel the next night.

TEATREE (2003): The Columbia Hotel is a gorgeous old hotel from 1910. Owen, the owner, gave a nice hiker rate and had even hiked a big section of the trail.

NOCOONA (2004): The Knight's Inn Motel is very nice, has a great hot tub, and an el cheapo Mexican restaurant right next door that gives a discount if you are staying at the Knight's Inn. Also, there is a nice laundromat, barber shop, Subway, Rite Aid (US PO in the store with extended hours), Albertson's, Stop and Save (or similar), etc. nearby. I recommend it, because we were able to buy all of our food for Oregon, package it and mail it via UPS (the UPS store was right there) without any hassles. Regular buses ran into downtown from the front of the hotel.

LAUNDRY: Laundromat downtown, and near Albertson's, also laundry at the hostel.

PCT REGISTER: At the hostel, at the Post Office, and at the Ashland Outdoor Store.

CASCADE TRAIL: Concrete, WA to Sedro Woolley, WA
